IEEE MEMBERS: JOEL BECKER IS LOOKING FOR YOU

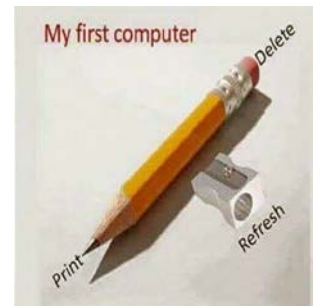
