Musings from Joel Becker about Office 365 Home/Personal

Office 365 is a subscription based productivity suite that offers access to various Microsoft services and software. Launched nearly two years ago, Microsoft has provided regular updates as well as improvements to the “cloud (ugh)” productivity suite.

Home \$80/year

- Fully installed Office for PC/Mac
- Install on up to 5 PCs or Macs, 5 tablets, and 5 phones
- 1 TB of OneDrive cloud storage each for up to 5 users

Personal \$60/year

- Fully installed Office for PC/Mac
- Install on 1 PC or Mac, 1 tablet, and 1 phone
- 1 TB of OneDrive cloud storage

I subscribed to the home version 6 months ago and found that I needed their unlimited support by phone, chat and TeamViewer (but that’s just me). Some of the techs were OK, some not, and I believe one guy downloaded a PUP which drove me mad (computers do that to me)

Whatever Happened to Peter Harrington

I joined the Charlotte County Computer Group Corporation (FL) shortly after I moved here in 2015. The CCCGC rents space in the Charlotte County Cultural Center. The office is open 5 days / week, 4 hours / day, to service any member who comes in. CCCGC has all their activities in one place, much simpler than CCCP. CCCGC's activities fall into several areas:

- Staff an office. Office personnel maintain membership records, hand out PCs, and accept PCs for repair. Volunteers provide technical support to the members. Members may bring in their PC or laptop to have programs installed or to have them repaired. Members may get individual help for specific problems or questions about their PC. CCCGC conducts afternoon classes for members, covering topics such as Windows 10, Word, Excel, maintenance, backup, etc. Most members join for this support, and several volunteer members provide that support. These classes and consultations are held in this office area:



Supply refurbished PCs to students and veterans. CCCGC works with the local schools and accepts recommendations from guidance counselors concerning students who need PCs and cannot afford them. We give PCs to needy veterans who can use a PC. We provide PCs to community non-profit organizations. We wipe the disks, repair the PCs as needed, and install MRR Windows 10 and a few free apps, similar to CCCP. These PCs and laptops are donated mostly by individuals and also a few organizations nearby. We refurbish PCs here:

Disassemble PCs and other equipment we cannot use, and separate the parts into bins of copper, aluminum, etc. for sale to scrap dealers. Again, all done by volunteer members. We strip the PCs in the room shown past the door to the right above.

- Conduct a monthly meeting for all members. About 100 members attend, and listen to a presentation on a topic of the day. These are lively meetings, with many questions and comments.

Moratorium on accepting desktops for donation, from any entity

The demand for computers has been switching from desktops to laptops for some time. As a result, we have an extreme oversupply of desktops, with some of them going back to 2014. They just don't move! There are at minimum 20 desktop refurbished and ready to go.

Because of this oversupply, we have decided to put in a 6 month moratorium on accepting desktops from all donors.



I know that many volunteers have personal connections to some large scale (libraries, schools, businesses) donors, with the donors contacting a volunteer directly. As a result, you might find it difficult to turn down these donors, especially if they want to give us laptops as well as desktops. But we really cannot accept these desktops, (unless of course, you want to store them in your homes!)

When you speak to the potential donor, please be extremely thankful to them, asking them to keep us on the top of their list. Also, do accept things we need if they are on the donors' list.

RIGHT NOW, we need Mice/Keyboards, USB cables, Hard Drives....but NO Monitors, at present.
